



READ AND SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING: TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE, ELECTRICAL SHOCK, OR INJURY TO PERSONS, PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING:

- 1]. To ensure the success of the installation, be sure to read the instructions and review the diagrams thoroughly before beginning.
- 2]. To avoid possible electric shock, be sure electricity is turned off at the main power box before wiring. All electrical connections must be made in accordance with local codes, ordinances and/or the National Electric Code. If you are unfamiliar with the methods of installing electrical wiring and products, require the services of a qualified and licensed electrician as well as someone who can check the strength of the supportive ceiling members and make the proper installations and connections.
- 3]. Make sure that your installation site will not allow rotating fan blades to come in contact with any object when fan is in operation. **Blades must mounted at least 7 feet from the floor.**
- 4]. If possible, mount ceiling fan on a ceiling joist the joist must be able to support the motion and weight of the moving fan. If the fan will be mounted on a ceiling outlet box, a 4" x 2-1/8" deep METAL octagon box is required; one UL listed as " suitable for fan support ". The box and its supporting members must not be able to twist or work loose. DO NOT USE PLASTIC BOXES. Installation on a concrete ceiling should be performed by qualified personnel.
- 5]. Blades should be attached after motor housing is hung and in place. Fan motor housing should be kept in carton until ready to be installed to protect its finish. If you are installing more than one ceiling fan, make sure that you do not mix fan blade sets.
- 6]. After making electrical connections, spliced conductors should be turned upward and pushed carefully up into outlet box. The wires should be spread apart with the grounded conductor and the equipment grounding conductor on one side of the outlet box and the "HOT" wires on the opposite side.
- 7]. Electrical diagrams are for reference only. Light kits that are not packed with the fan must be UL listed and should be installed per the light kit's installation instructions.
- 8]. After fan is completely installed, check to make sure that all connections are secured to prevent fan from falling and/or causing damage or injury.
- 9]. The fan can be made to work immediately after installation. There is no need to oil your fan. The motor has permanently lubricated bearings.
- 10]. The fan must be turned off and stopped before reversing fan direction.
- 11]. The fan is for flush mount only.
- 12]. This fan is controlled by remote.
- 13]. This fan is suitable for damp location use.
- 14]. This fan is reversible.
 - "Special note: All green grounding wire(s) from fan must be attached to house Ground/Earth wire to prevent flickering of LED."


Unpack and inspect fan carefully to ensure all contents are included.



WARNING: blades should be at least 7 feet from floor




Use metal outlet box suitable for fan support.

1. HANGING SYSTEM INSTALLATION


1-1. Installing mounting plate to ceiling outlet box

Install mounting plate to outlet box on ceiling by using screws included with the outlet box and washers from the hardware bag.



1-2. Hanging the fan

Lift the fan assembly and hang onto the <u>J hook</u> from mounting plate. This will permit you to make the electrical connections without having to hold the fan up as well.





2. WIRE CONNECTION

2-1. Verify that serial Number & Model Number match on the Receiver and Transmitter NOTICE:

Many remote sets for DC fans look the same. This remote set <u>is pre-paired</u> and labeled at the factory, please note the following before operation:

- 1a. The Remote Model Number on transmitter and receiver <u>must</u> be the same.
- 1b. The Remote Serial Number will be the same on a pre-paired remote set. If it is different, it will need to be paired. (See page 12)
- 2. The Fan Model Number label <u>must</u> be the same as the fan's model number in front page (3ME52) for proper operation. (There is no Fan Model Number on transmitter.)
- 3. Do not mix the remote sets if you are installing more than one fan.






2-3. Making electrical wire connection

Follow diagram below and make sure that all exposed wires are secured inside wire nuts.

Note: Wires from house may vary in color. If the house wires do NOT include a ground/earth wire (bare or green), please consult an electrician. To prevent flickering in the light, this unit must be grounded/earthed.

After wiring is completed, place wires in the canopy.




3. CANOPY INSTALLATION

Canopy installation and attachment


Carefully lift the fan housing away from mounting plate J hook, after connecting the wires.

- (1) Remove two opposing screws and washers on mounting plate first, then loosen the other two.
- 2 Push up the canopy, aligning the L-slots to the loosened screws on mounting plate.
- 3 Rotate the canopy slightly until the two screw heads are secured in the ends of the L-slots.
- 4 Reinstall the two screws removed from 1, and tighten all four mounting plate screws firmly.



4. FAN HOUSING INSTALLATION

- (1) Align RED arrow sticker on the inner top of Fan Housing with the arrow sticker on the Canopy.
- ② Pull out the Red arrow sticker before attaching the Fan Housing to the Canopy.
- ③ Push up the Fan Housing until 4 screw heads on Canopy are engaged with the Grooves (on the inner top of Fan Housing).
- ④ Rotate the Fan Housing slightly until 4 screw heads on Canopy are **in the Grooves**, and make sure 4 screw heads are well fixed in the Grooves.



5. BLADE INSTALLATION

① Insert the blade between motor and adapter.
② Attach blade to motor using two Blade screws and Flat Washers from hardware bag, via cut-out in adapter.
(*Repeat this step with two remaining blades. Tighten all screws firmly.)




6. INSTALLATION FOR LIGHT KIT PAN

Note: Slightly loosen the three screws pre-installed on adapter for light kit pan installation.

- ① Connect the JST connector (Blue and Orange) from fan to the LED light.
- ② Push up light kit pan until three pre-installed screws on adapter are engaged with three key holes from light kit pan.
- 3 Rotate light kit pan slightly until three pre-installed screws heads are engaged in the narrow end of key holes.
- 4 Tighten three screws.



(5) Raise Light Dome to Light pan and align the grooves with the tabs. Turn clockwise to secure, but do not over tighten.




*Important Notice: For this fan with LED light, the ground wire must be connected to prevent LED flickering.


7. TRANSMITTER INSTALLATION

The enclosed Transmitter can be mounted in many ways:

- 1. On-Wall at any convenient location, see Section (2).
- 2. In-Wall in US switch boxes (multi-gang and single-gang decora), see Section (3).
- 3. Either way can be still used as a Hand-Held transmitter, or
- 4. It can be Permanently Stationed either On-Wall or In-Wall, see Section (4).


B. Decora In-Wall Installation (for U.S.A.)

(3) DECORA IN-WALL INSTALLATION (USA)


Warning: Turn off power at breaker box to avoid possible electric shock.

3-1. Remove the wall plate by loosening screws from the wall plate. (Keep these screws for step 3-6.) Note: Can be installed in single- or multiple-gang

switch box.



3-2. Uninstall the wall switch from the switch box by removing two screws from the switch box. (Keep these screws for step 3-5.)



Warning: Make sure the power is turned off at the breaker box before touching anything in this box.


Caution: If you are uncomfortable identifying and connecting 120V AC wiring connections, we recommend you

hire a licensed electrician to perform this installation.

Caution: The following wiring instructions are valid for a simple on/off toggle switch in a single gang box.

Caution: If your switch has more than two wires (not counting any ground wire or jumpers), we recommend hiring a licensed electrician to identify and complete the wiring connections.

- 3-3. Remove the wall switch from the switch box, and disconnect the following wires from the wall switch:
- (1) Remove Black wire that goes to ceiling junction box
- ② Remove Black wire(s) that comes from AC source




3-4. Connect the Black wire that goes to the ceiling box to the Black wire(s) from the AC source using the wire nuts provided.

Note: Ground wires are usually twisted together in the box and do not require wire nut. If your ground wires are separated. connect them with a provided wire nut.


Note: The White wires (neutral) should remain tucked in the back of the box.

Note: Make sure that all exposed wires are secured inside wire nuts. Carefully tuck wires neatly back into switch box.





IMPORTANT: FAN'S REMOTE RECEIVER IS NOW DIRECTLY CONNECTED TO AC POWER. ON/OFF IS NOW OPERATED BY REMOTE TRANSMITTER.

3-5. Install the Decora In-Wall bracket onto the switch box with the single post at the bottom as shown, and attach two screws removed from step 3-2. (If in a multiple-gang box align the bracket using the wall plate first, then tighten the screws.)




3-6. Install the wall plate onto the switch box and attach the screws removed from step 3-1.





You have completed the In-Wall Mount installation.




Turn on the power at breaker box, the fan is ready for operation!



8. OPERATIONAL INSTRUCTION

Warning: DO NOT PRESS THE () BUTTON FOR MORE THAN 4 SECONDS TO AVOID FACTORY RESET AND THE LOSS OF PRE-PAIRED PROGRAMING OF RECEIVER AND TRANSMITTER!

All the button pressed will have a Beep sound and the red indicator light will turn on.



- 8-1. Indicator
- 8-2. Press \circ button to turn the fan ON/OFF.

Note: On every startup, the fan will move forward & backward for 2~3 seconds.

- 8-3. Reverse switch
- 8-4. Short press for Light ON.
 Hold the button for dimming the light.
- 8-5. WiFi Pairing

(long press for 5 seconds, see more information for WiFi setting in step 11.)

8-6. Short press for Light Off / long press for AP mode.

(See more information for WiFi setting in step 11.)

8-7. Fan Speed: **1-** Low Speed → **5-** High Speed 8-8. 12V battery (23AE/A23) included,

install in front.

NOTE: Make sure the DIP switch is on dimming position. (See 1-3 in Page 7)

9. CCT LED OPERATION

A. Color temperature operation

Short press **Light ON** / **Light OFF** buttons within 7 seconds for <u>changing</u> color temperature. It will cycle through 2700K Warm White, 5000K Daylight and 3000K Soft White.

To keep a color temperature the same, wait longer than 7 seconds between turning on again.


- 1. Short press Light ON ♥ for 2700K

 Press Light OFF ♥ for next color temperature
- 2. Short press Light ON for 5000K

 Press Light OFF for next color temperature
- 3. Short press Light ON ♥ for 3500K

 Press Light OFF ♥ for next color temperature

 (Continued short presses will cycle through these color temperatures.)



B. Dimming operation

- 1. Long press the Light ON 🔯 button for dimming to adjust the brightness.
- 2. Holding the Light ON 🔯 button will cycle the brightness up and down.


*When the light is turned off, the remote will remember the last brightness level and color temperature selected when turned on again.

Note: Press () button to turn the fan ON/OFF. The remote retains the last settings (fan speed and light dimming level) in memory. If the fan is unintentionally turned OFF and ON again at the main power or during a power failure, the fan will be OFF and the Light will be ON (to indicate power is present) as that is the initial setting of the remote.

TROUBLESHOOTING

In the event the fan does not operate properly, please perform the following steps.

- 1. Lower the canopy and check that all wires are connected properly.
- 2. Perform the remote Pairing Process at step 9-1 on P12.



10. REMOTE PAIRING PROCESS

The Pairing Process is only necessary when there is an issue. Remote set <u>is pre-paired</u> from the factory and should not require the Pairing Process.

A fan may need to have "Pairing Process" performed for the following issues.

- 1. Replacing the transmitter.
- 2. Replacing the receiver.
- 3. Multiple fans on the same circuit.

(In multiple fans situation, each fan must be wired up individually for the Pairing Process; see step 10-1.)

10-1. PAIRING PROCESS FOR TRANSMITTER AND RECEIVER:

- 1. Switch off the main power off and make sure fan has completely stopped.
- 2. Install a New receiver or install the battery in a new transmitter before the Pairing Process.
- 3. Switch on the power again, and immediately:


Press and hold the (for 8 seconds until the Receiver "Long Beeps".

This process must be done within 20 seconds after switching on the power.

This fan has completed the pairing successfully and the fan is ready for operation!

10-2A. Pairing Process for Multiple fans (One transmitter for multiple receivers)

If you wish to use only **one transmitter for two fans**, simply wire up both fans at one time and perform the Pairing Process at **step 10-1** from a point between the two fans.




10-2B. Pairing Process for Multiple fans (One transmitter for one receiver)

The Pairing Process must be performed on each remote set (transmitter and receiver) individually. See the set up at step 10-3.

10-3. TO SET UP REMOTE FOR #1 FAN

Make sure to turn off power at breaker box. Disconnecting wire from #2 fan.

Before starting the remote control setting process, lower the canopy of #2 Fan and disconnect the Black wire.



Turn on power at breaker box and #1 Fan is ready for pairing.


*See the remote control setting process 10-1 to set up #1 Fan.



10-4. TO SET UP REMOTE FOR #2 FAN

Turn on power at breaker box and #2 Fan is ready for setting.






10-5. RECONNECT ALL FANS


Make sure to turn off power at breaker box.

After all the fans have done the resetting process, reconnect all the wires for #1 fan & #2 fan, and lift up the Canopy of #1 fan & #2 fan.





10-6. Switch on the main power and now each of these two fans are operated by its own remote individually.



NOTE: For more than two fans, the same rules apply. Make sure only one fan at a time is connected to power when doing the Remote Setting. Already completed fans should be disconnected until all fans have completed the Remote Setting process.

11. WIFI PAIRING

A. Installation

You can scan the QR code below to download the **Smart Life** app.

You can also search "Smart Life" in major application markets to install the app.







C. WiFi Connect

NOTE: You must turn on the "Location Services" before WiFi pairing.

- 1. First ensure that WiFi can be used normally and you have the password.
- 2. Click "Add Device", first select "Small Home Appliance", then select "Fan (Wi-Fi)".



3. Press and hold the " button of the transmitter for more than 5 seconds. Wait until the ceiling fan receiver emits "BeeBee" continuously. The remote makes this noise instead of a blinking indicator as described in the app.




4. Select the correct WiFi source, then enter the WiFi password and click "Confirm", click "Confirm the indicator is blinking" then select "Blink Quickly" and wait while "Connecting".








5. Wait for a successful connection.





NOTE: In case of above WiFi Pairing failed, please follow below and pairing. (AP Mode)

1. Press and hold the " • " button of the transmitter for more than 5 seconds. Wait until the ceiling fan receiver emits "**BeeBee**" continuously.



2. Click "Confirm the indicator is blinking" and select "Blink Slowly" to enter AP Mode.






3. Select the device's hotspot then wait while "Connecting".



4. Wait for a successful connection.





D. More Details and Multiple Users

- 1. In the App's Main Control Panel, click the " Z " in the upper right corner for more functions.

 - a. Tap on the icon or name to change either.b. Tap "Share Device", "Add Sharing".








2. Enter the phone number of another Smart Life user, and click "**Completed**" to share. Hint: The simplest way to share multiple devices with multiple users is to log in as a
